Call to Prayer

Very early in Jesus' ministry the disciples humbly asked their master, "Lord teach us to pray," an admission that effective prayer is not readily grasped and is very much a learning process. And indeed, that describes the journey that I have needed to pursue throughout my life. Meaningful, effective prayer has not come easily and has required humility and willingness to learn. I wish to share some of the things that the Lord has taught my wife Eva and me regarding this foundational and essential practice of living a life of prayer that draws us ever closer to the Lord, to discern his ways, hear and follow his voice, and pursue his purposes.

Even as the "Lord's Prayer" begins with an acknowledgment of the holy presence of our heavenly Father, I have had to realize that prayer is more about worship and praising God for who he is and what he has done than presenting my personal and intercessory requests for others. It is a time to lift up God's name and attributes and enter into the realization that he, our loving and caring Father, is to be honored first, and that his provisions and interest in every aspect of our lives flow out of his love. Indeed, the cares and burdens of life that we carry for ourselves and others often cause us to neglect that foundational aspect of prayer.

Effective prayer requires faith, intentionality, and perseverance. It's not a quick automatic repetition of the "Lord's Prayer" or reciting "Now I lay me down to sleep." In addition, it is not easy to persevere when prayers seem to go unanswered or countless urgent life pressures distract. When I would ask Eva if she had time to pray with me, her response would inevitably be, "I always have time to pray!"

Taking time to join in deliberate focused prayer with your spouse or a close friend requires commitment and sacrifice but underscores the power of collective intercession, "where two or three are gathered in his name."

There were times in life when there was nothing left to do but pray. Precisely in those times we were drawn to prayer and discovered a deeper meaning of prayer. Not knowing how to pray, we learned to trust God; we learned to turn our lives over to our loving Father in total surrender and dependence. Prayer became a time of communion and listening to his voice of comfort, instruction and direction.

Answers to Prayer

- **Yosiah and Anita Rahma** (names changed) are grateful to the Lord for the ways Christians in their majority-Muslim nation in Southeast Asia have responded with generosity after a devastating fire in their slum neighborhood. Yosiah and Anita have also been distributing relief with the help of their teachers at House of Hope. Anita writes, "Our second fire-relief distribution went well. Our church donated 65 food packs and we purchased 65 rice cookers. While a rice cooker may seem like a strange thing to give those who lost everything in a fire, it's the first appliance any family would want here. Cooking rice to eat three times a day is a lot easier with a rice cooker. It can also be used to cook soups, steam vegetables, and cook other things. We set up a "free store" of children's clothes and shoes, and each family could come through and pick 10 items. We are so grateful for our teaching team—we couldn't have done this without their help. Most families affected by the fire have found new places to rent, and some have rebuilt their houses."
- Join **Steve Horst and Bethany Tobin** in praising God for a new house church being planted in the village of Ban Nong Udom in the Isaan region of Thailand by ministry partners Songkran and Lot. When the Thailand E3 Collective prayer team was there in September, they spent a day praying in this new village, for and with the new families who are interested and learning about the gospel. "There was tremendous openness to receiving healing and prayer. What was exciting was that it was the whole household that was gathered and interested, and the son in particular, who is a coach of a local soccer program, made a profession of faith," wrote Bethany. "A few days later, Nam Yuen church members visited and the families were asking about receiving baptism. Praise God for this open door! Pray that whole families would believe and be baptized and receive the full impact of God's salvation."

Ways to Pray

Jesus invited his disciples to follow him, promising that he would show them how to "fish for people." (Mark 1:17) Just as Jesus multiplied the catch of fish for his fisherman disciples, so Jesus wants to multiply the "catch of people" for his followers today.

Ways to pray for multiplication as you "fish for people:"

- **Ask God to show you where to fish.** Are there places where you regularly interact with non-believers? If not, ask God to show you where you might start connecting with non-believers on a regular basis. Maybe it's joining a secular mom's group, a bike club, or a yoga class. Or maybe it's spending more time in your backyard or on your street getting to know your neighbors.
- **Pray for specific persons.** Be explicit in your asking. Pray for specific non-believers in your lives and pray that they will know Christ.
- **Pray for opportunities.** Ask God to open doors for conversations with the non-believers you're praying for. Trust God to provide spaces and opportunities to share his love with your non-believing friends. Not only do we invite God to work in those relationships in that way, we also increase our awareness and intentionality in such opportunities. It's harder to miss the open doors when you're looking for them.
- **Ask others to pray with you and hold you accountable.** Consider joining a Life Transformation Group as a guided way to do this.
- **Ask God for divine appointments.** Be open to ways God might be inviting you to cast your nets outside of your regular zones of interaction. Begin each day asking God who you should share with that day. You might meet someone in the grocery store check-out line who just needs an encouraging word, or you may run into an old acquaintance who really needs a reminder that God cares for them. Ask God to make you aware of ways to show His love through you each day. And when God speaks, ask for the courage to obey!
