Answers to Prayer

- **Lee and Peg Martin**, serving with SWAP (Sharing With Appalachian People) in Kimball, West Virginia, give thanks to God for the willing volunteers who served with SWAP on teams to make the homes of community members more safe, warm, and dry. "We trust Jesus is better known through it all," they write.
- Recently, the Enciende Una Luz congregation (Harrisonburg, Va.) had a worship retreat at Brethren Woods to empower and equip the next generation of worship leaders and to intentionally set aside time to worship God together. **Hannah Shultz**, a VMMissions worker serving in music and discipleship ministry, had the privilege of joining on Saturday and teaching a few sessions. She writes, "Praise the Lord for meeting us in such a special way! It was so sweet to reconnect with brothers and sisters that I met with on a regular basis when I first started serving with VMMissions. It was particularly touching to witness God's transformation in the life of a youth who has dedicated his life to Christ and been baptized."
- **Vicki Barnes**, serving with VMMissions in college ministry at Eastern Mennonite University (EMU), Harrisonburg, Va., in partnership with Every Nation Campus, was involved in hosting a fall retreat for students. More than 60 students in the Shenandoah Valley participated, including 14 from EMU. It was a time of building and strengthening foundations with the gospel. Vicki writes, "After fall retreat, I've heard countless students state that they are excited to get involved in serving and leading in some capacity as they continue to attend [their] university. For some of our students, they are learning to read their Bible—but they are also hungry to learn how to share their faith with others!"

Ways to Pray

Pray for boldness.

Mission workers need supernatural boldness to proclaim the gospel, especially in areas where Christians face intense persecution.

You can pray that:

- They will not give in to fear but will remember that God has not given them a spirit of fear, but of power and love and a sound mind (2 Timothy 1:7).
- They will be filled with the Holy Spirit to courageously and boldly preach the gospel not just with words, but in power (1 Thessalonians 1:5, 1 Corinthians 2:4).

"Pray also for me, that whenever I speak, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the Gospel." – Ephesians 6:19

Pray for the people they are ministering to.

Through the power of prayer, hearts that are resistant to the gospel can be softened and become fertile soil for the truth to grow and produce fruit (Matthew 13:1-23).

You can pray that:

- Any barriers that would keep people from following Jesus, such as family, fear of persecution, false religions, etc., will be broken down by the power of the Holy Spirit.
- Their hearts will be soft, receptive, and open to the gospel.
- God will deliver them from spiritual blindness and supernaturally open their eyes to the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ (2 Corinthians 4:4-6).
- God will lead them to a community of believers and that they will become disciples who produce much fruit for God's glory.
