Ways to Pray

In June, our church planned a very special celebration of baptism and communion, during which three people had the opportunity to publicly witness the transformation that Jesus made in their lives and despite all the challenges they faced in deciding their faith, they remained firm and convinced of God's work in their lives.

M., who in past years celebrated the Feast of Sacrifice with her Muslim family, this time celebrated the new life in Christ with her family of faith. Unfortunately, no one from her family came to attend the service, which we understood very well, and we pray that in God's time the truth and love of Jesus will touch their hearts.

C. and P., despite coming from a Catholic family, are being persecuted by their own tribes. This is very common in Albania. Here families are organized into tribes, are extreme followers of religious traditions, and all decisions are based on what will bring them shame or honor. Because of this cultural context, most people who convert go through many challenges, conflicts, and discouragement.

C. with his wife and two little children have been living with his parents (which is common here). When the elder of the tribe (his oldest uncle) discovered that he and his wife had been baptized, he gathered all the men of the tribe and went to their house accusing them of embarrassing the tribe for "switching religion" and tried to force them to go back on their decision. C. did not accept it, and so the tribe has disinherited him, which means he is now dead to them, and he must leave home with his wife and children. This is a very complicated situation, and as a local church we are providing spiritual support and providing a place for the family to live.

At this time they really need the prayers of their family of faith, and especially for the family elders who are at the center of it all. In this situation, we pray that God works in their hearts, transforming all hatred and indifference into love, and transforms the conflict into peace. We praise God that despite everything, we see growth and firmness of C. and P. with the Lord.



BORDER PERSPECTIVE

At the end of June and beginning of July, a team of youth from Enciende Una Luz, Harrisonburg, Va., spent a week at the Texas/Mexico border along with two couples and VMMissions worker **Hannah Shultz** to participate in Border Perspective, an E³ Collective trip.

Trip leaders reported that the experience was very spiritually and missionally impactful for the youth, and they were excited to share the love of Jesus with folks coming across the border with great spiritual and physical need.

Hannah wrote, "Praise God for the body of Christ! It is beautiful to be part of God's global family and to share His goodness with others together! The prayers of the righteous are powerful and effective. I believe that the prayers that have been prayed are opening spiritual doors that we wouldn't be able to walk through otherwise—that hearts are being softened for the truth that we get to share!"

- For strength, health, and wisdom to guide these new believers through difficult circumstances.
