Call to Prayer

At the beginning of May, two of my classmates and friends from Eastern Mennonite University and I embarked on a life-shaking experience for five weeks. Through our connections with VMMissions workers Yosiah and Anita (names changed), lots of prayer, and other nudges from God, we were given the opportunity to travel outside of what we know and live in a slum located in Southeast Asia.

One of our main goals was to live with and get to know the incredible people who live there. We did this mainly by playing with the many children in the slum community who come to the free kindergarten that Yosiah and Anita started. As we began to learn the local language (a little), we were able to help the children with their reading and math homework. To say that I learned a lot and experienced people's never-ending generosity is an understatement.

It was amazing that even though the communication barrier was difficult, I felt very connected to my host family. There were incredible things I saw and participated in. These included playing with the school kids at a playground, conversations about faith with my host mother, growing closer with my friends who came with me, visiting a local Mennonite church, learning and growing with Yosiah and Anita's family, and seeing God's work and love in the slum. There were also the challenges of constant heat with no air conditioning, dengue fever, visa problems, homesickness, feeling tired and drained, or just feeling helpless. But the challenges were just as important for me as the good things, if not more so. They made me turn to Christ each day and I continued to see his faithfulness and provision come through.

Coming home, I feel as though my faith in Jesus has only gotten stronger as I have seen his power being revealed to me. I continue to pray for my host family, for Yosiah and Anita and their family, and for all of the slums in that country. I pray the people there will know Jesus and that God's work will continue to be done. I hope you will too.

Answers to Prayer

EVERY NATION CAMPUS CONFERENCE

Currently, the four VMMissions workers serving in college ministry serve with Every Nation Campus (ENC), supported by their sending congregation Divine Unity Community Church in Harrisonburg, Virginia.

Vicki Barnes, serving at Eastern Mennonite University, Harrisonburg, Va., joined campus ministers and interns across North America at the ENC Staff Summit in Orlando, Florida, to rejuvenate, connect with fellow missionaries, and gain additional tools and professional development. The Staff Summit led into another conference for church staff, pastors, and leaders to realign with ENC's mission and vision, and develop relationships with other churches and individuals.

Vicki writes, "We are celebrating 30 years as Every Nation! I am thankful to be a part of an organization that seeks to honor God and make disciples in all nations. This year, I went into these spaces desiring to make new connections and hear God's voice about what he is wanting to do around the nation, and how he wants to use me. I was able to meet some amazing new missionaries, and I received more clarity about my call to ministry. We spent time praying for our church plants, for the nations that we have reached, and for un-reached nations.

I deeply enjoy being able to do this work and am thankful for sweet moments to gather as believers, to worship together, to be equipped and challenged, and leave encouraged. But, I also recognize the burden to continue doing what God has commanded: 'Go and make disciples of all nations.' I am excited for all that God will do as we continue reaching college students with the gospel!"

Ways to Pray

Pray that God would open doors of gospel ministry to the unreached.

The reality is that many of the places that most need the gospel have significant barriers to gospel ministry. Those barriers can be political or they can be cultural. Governments try to stop the entrance of missionaries to a place or stop the ministry of missionaries in that place, or the people themselves need to have their hearts softened by the Spirit to hear and receive the word. God has the power to break down any barrier, and has appointed prayer as the means by which he often intends to do so.

Pray for mission workers to present the gospel boldly and clearly.

We often imagine that mission workers have natural boldness, but we imagine wrongly. Even the apostle Paul asks for prayer for boldness! And we hope to be clear, crystalizing the message in a way that can be understood by people for the first time in a way that lays the proper foundation for knowing and walking with God. When we pray for the work of missions, we are joining an essential work as co-laborers.

Pray for workers to endure hardship.

Modern travel makes getting to the mission field easier than ever. Once there, endurance is the precious commodity. In many places, living cross-culturally means enduring frustration and frequent setbacks. Mission workers share the gospel and have to leave the results in God's hands, but it may mean years without discernible fruit. Even in places where the Spirit is bringing about conversion, it takes incredible patience to see a ministry all the way through to indigenous leadership. When we pray for missionaries, we should pray for their endurance. We should pray for toughness and resolve which would characterize soldiers on the front lines of ministry.

You also must help us by prayer, so that many will give thanks on our behalf for the blessing granted us through the prayers of many.—2 Corinthians 1:11 (ESV)
