Call to Prayer

You and I were made for work! Not just the work we do in exchange for a paycheck, but the common vocation we engage because we have given our lives to the Lord Jesus. In giving our lives to Jesus, we discover that there is something that our Lord wants us to do.

One of those things he wants us to do is to pray.

And despite the volumes written and sermons preached, if I am to be honest, there is nothing in my Christian life quite as challenging and counter-intuitive as this work of prayer.

In what sense is prayer work? I would not argue that it is work because something is accomplished by virtue of our doing it. If prayer had some sort of straightforward causal function, it would suggest that we, rather than God, were in the driver's seat. Not so! Prayer for me is work because it is a vigorous expression of belief and belief is hard work.

In John 6, when the disciples ask Jesus what they must do to do the works of God, Jesus says “believe in the one he has sent.” When we pray, we are joining the likes of blind Bartemaeus who cried out with importunity as Jesus passed on the road, “Lord, have mercy upon me!” We entreat and implore because we can’t fix the things that are wrong. Yet, there is nothing weak and pathetic about the prayers we direct towards our Lord.

To turn to God in prayer is not the same as shrugging our shoulders and saying nothing can be done. No! Our prayer is a faith stand—a vigorous expression of confidence, an insistence that God is indeed the one before whom our complaint and appeal must be laid.

And even more challenging is the sobering realization that we have been commissioned by the Lord Jesus himself to not only cry out our appeal, but to carry his very authority in prayer!

Worker profile: **Ken Wettig**

Service location: Harrisonburg, Virginia

Program: transForm | **Serving since:** 2021

Assignment: I serve as the director of SLAQ (Servant Leader Quest), a program that seeks to raise up diverse cohorts among the next generation of serving leaders in the way of Jesus through outdoor adventures, community service, and “crucial conversations.” We come alongside both Christian families and the local church to create formative experiences that both support and challenge youth in developing the kind of character and leadership that we see in the person of Jesus.

Biggest challenge: Time. We live in such a busy culture, and unfortunately the same is true for high school-aged youth as well. So, making sure the schedule is laid out months in advance, and that all the various pieces are well-communicated represents much of the challenge in this sort of ministry. Finally, just getting out of the way and letting the Holy Spirit work among the Serving Leaders and youth as they really own the learning experience.

Biggest joy: Every aspect of the cohort takes significant levels of behind-the-scenes coordination and planning, which can be taxing, but once that work reaches its intended purpose—our learning activities—it is all worth it. Whether the outdoor excursion, the community service, or the crucial conversations, the youth bring a lot of energy and excitement to everything we do, and I find it an honor to be a part of it every time.

Ways to Pray

PRAY FOR OPEN DOORS

“Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with thanksgiving. At the same time pray for us as well that God will open to us a door for the word...” (Colossians 4:2,3)

- Pray that God will open doors of ministry, partnership, and friendship.
- Pray that the Holy Spirit will lead mission workers.

PRAY FOR BOLDNESS

“Pray also for me, so that when I speak, a message may be given to me to make known with boldness the mystery of the gospel... Pray that I may declare it boldly.” (Ephesians 6:19-20)

- Pray for effective cross-cultural communication.
- Pray for boldness to speak God’s Word.

PRAY THAT THE WORD OF GOD WILL SPREAD

“Finally, brothers and sisters, pray for us, so that the word of the Lord may spread rapidly and be glorified everywhere.” (2 Thessalonians 3:1)

- Pray that spiritual forces of evil will not hinder the spread of the gospel.
- Pray that the Word of God will be received with joy.

PRAY FOR PROTECTION

“Pray that we may be rescued from wicked and evil people; for not all have faith.” (2 Thessalonians 3:2)

- Pray that the Lord will guard mission workers from the evil one.
- Pray that the Holy Spirit will change the hearts of those who hear the Word.

Pray for God’s guidance in travel; pray for refreshment of body, mind, and spirit

“Pray that by God’s will I may come to you with joy and be refreshed in your company.” (Romans 15:32)

- Pray for protection and provision in travel.
- Pray for spiritual refreshment from the Holy Spirit in the company of other believers.
